

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## INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

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To the Town of Ajax - City Clerk

### *Qualified Opinion*

We have audited the accompanying financial statement (Form 4) of Carion Fenn (the Candidate), for the campaign period from July 10, 2018 to March 28, 2019 relating to the election held on October 22, 2018 and Box C: Statement of Campaign Period Income and Expenses for the period and Box D: Calculation of Surplus or Deficit. The financial information has been prepared by Carion Fenn, the candidate, based on the financial reporting provisions of Section 88.22 of the Municipal elections Act, 1996.

In our opinion, except for the possible effects of the matter described in the *Basis for Qualified Opinion* section of our report, the accompanying financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the income and expenses of the Candidate for the campaign period from July 10, 2018 to December 31, 2018 in accordance with the financial reporting provisions of section 88.22 of the Municipal elections Act, 1996.

### *Basis for Qualified Opinion*

Due to the inherent nature of the transactions of electoral campaigns of this type, the completeness of the various categories of income and expenses is not susceptible to satisfactory audit verification. Accordingly, our verification of income and expenses was limited to the amounts recorded in the records of the Candidate and we were not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to income, expenses and surplus/deficit for the period from July 10, 2018 to March 28, 2019.

We conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report. We are independent of the Candidate in accordance with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements in Canada, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with those requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified audit opinion.

### *Basis of Accounting*

Without modifying our qualified opinion, we draw attention to the fact that the financial statement is prepared to assist the candidate to meet the requirements of the Municipal Elections Act, 1996, and as a result, the financial statement may not be suitable for another purpose.

### *Responsibilities of the Candidate and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements*

The Candidate and those charged with governance for the financial statements (together "management") are responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with financial reporting provisions of Section 88.22 of the Municipal Elections Act, 1996, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of the financial statement that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

### *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements*

Independent Auditor's Report to the Town of Ajax - City Clerk of *(continued)*

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

As part of an audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statement, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Candidate's campaign internal control.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by management.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statement, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that consistent with the accounting requirements of the Municipal Elections Act, 1996.
